1.2A Identify main ideas and some details when reading and listening.	<ul> <li>ask easy questions to get needed information</li> <li>understand the main idea(s) and can pick out a few details in brief oral and written texts on familiar topics supported by visuals.</li> <li>write much of what they can say by making lists, writing short messages and notes</li> <li>write brief Internet-based social communications, using words, phrases or short sentences</li> <li>make mistakes when they communicate</li> </ul>
